Linda B is resigning in the Extension office, Superior days staffing shorthanded. Pat L was inducted into the 4-H hall of fame. Reductions in the site reimbursements recommended, which would cut the reimbursement by 50%, will affect all townships. Mary Klun looking into possible curbside service for the county. Douglas County still trying to add the .5%sales tax for the county to assist with the roads, but they are getting pushback from the State. A resident asked what was the best process for the County to recognize the deteriorating and dangerous roads, and possibly get some action towards fixing them, all comes down to the funding shortage.
- 4) Fire Department and First Responders: Motion made by Scott and seconded by Nick, to amend the agenda and move the FD up as Nova had other commitments, carried 6:55 pm. FD had 4 calls. Did standby for the first annual "Running for Heroes", as well as standby for the Burrito Union fundraiser which helps the community. Fire safety in schools is next month. The Rescue still needs work. The FEMA grant info was completed and sent. They received a "thank you" from a fire/mutual aide they responded to. They are **desperate** for more people on the Fire Department they only have 10 active members and only 4 of them are from the township. Scott saw a possible trailer for the 4-wheeler and wanted to know if they were interested. Resident stepped up and offered to help with raising funds for the FD and the auxiliary, they have plenty of volunteers to help them, maybe even have a fun fair next summer, and they will discuss what is needed with Nova. October 11th Parkland FD is having a chili cook-off fundraiser 3-7pm, contact the Parkland FD if planning to attend.
