Regular Board Meeting August 8th, 2023

1.Meeting: Called to order by Chairman Scott Luostari at 6:08 pm.

3.County Board: Scott-Zoning in the morning, busy with sanitary permits. P.P. was eliminated this year. Zoning Corp Counsel still working on campground ordinance, will take some more time. Land Development-no viable bids came in on cleaning up the Highway E mobile home parks. They will not allow it to be turned into mobile home parks in the future. They still must clean up and take care of any asbestos. Most committees are starting back up. The County is still looking to fill the County Administer position. Transportation-working on highway 13, they were supposed to bring the pulverizer this way. Highway Y is completed, no news on Highway W (still waiting for Fed money). Started pulverizing U, but they still do not know how to fix the slide area. The designing phase on Highway H was adjusted as the DNR wants bigger culverts. Still having employee shortages in the highway department.

10. Fire Department: Nova arrived at the end of the meeting-Martin has been helping a lot. Worked out officers. Losing another member at the end of the month-Hope is leaving. All FDs are having these issues. The 3 new members finished 1st responder training. They are in the beginning stages of planning their memorial, they received a donation from the County to assist. Emergency Apparatus came and did some testing. Redesigning gear racks. Dry summer, wildfire danger is high. Trying to keep up on training and classes.

11. Town Employees and roads: Tom-Mark out making hay. Hard to grade right now. We must address the Pukema road issue-shore up the bank and try to get it to hold. The residents are worried about the corner caving in, going to try to shore it up. When UU gets pulverized next year maybe the Town can check see about doing some of the roads as well. Only need to do 2 passes with the brusher right now.

12. Building Permits and Zoning:

A) Olson-Still working, no action tonight, attorney needs to review documents.

B) Brown-S Peterson Road, permit denied until it comes back placing a 30-foot culvert.

C) McMahon-Mr. McMahon and Mr. Perkins were there to answer questions and explain their vision regarding the campgrounds. They are only planning 3 sites. The issue will be voted on by Douglas County tomorrow. There was lots of discussion on behalf of the residents in attendance. Most of the residents in attendance were against the

campground going on their road. They feel there are enough issues with the road/traffic already. The town added some suggested restrictions:

- A) They need to follow all sanitary policies and regulations outlined by Douglas County.
- B) Limit the number of people camping on each site to 6.
- C) No RV's, no motorized campers.

In August 2024, the board will revisit the issue and see how things are functioning and can issues change if necessary. Gerald made a motion to approve the campground with the stipulations, Mary seconded, carried 7:14 pm.
